W. A. Olmsted Elementary School is piloting a Writers Workshop program this year with the goal of improving both the writing and reading skills of every student.



This daily activity encourages children to write based on their own experiences, drawing upon details from their lives.

The plan is to move on to narrative and opinion writing as the year proceeds.

The Writers Workshop teaches students about writing with the teacher conducting individual mini-lessons generated from strategies the emergent writers demonstrate and eventually share with their peers.

The students are excited about writing and adding to their work each day by building in more details. As they become better writers, the students also become better readers.




## Varsity Hornets set records with Dryden win and a fifth MAC championship
