As winter break approaches, I want to reflect on how swiftly time has passed since we began our school year. Although we had a great start to the year, we faced a heartbreaking loss with the passing of senior Makai Wilkinson. I would like to extend my heartfelt thoughts and prayers to his family, friends, and everyone affected by this tragedy. The community's support during this difficult time has been a testament to Makai's impact and how much he will be missed.

We continue to provide support for our students and staff through counseling and behavioral supports. To lend additional support to our students, we have added three Binghamton University social work interns at the MS/HS, along with a full-time on-site supervisor. Along with the new interns, grant funding from Lourdes/ Ascension Hospital has allowed us to add a full-time student assistance counselor at the MS/HS. The counselor works with students on short-term goals and addresses risk factors in their lives. If your child needs support, please reach out to our school counselors or principals.

Our fall sports season was a huge success, with highlights including the boys' soccer team reaching the sectional semi-finals and the girls' field hockey team making it to the sectional finals. Congratulations to Kylee Noyes, who was selected for the all-state field hockey team. I am proud of our athletes and our coaches, and I thank all who came out to support our teams this fall on the field or court.

Also, I would like to recognize the Student Council and National Honor Society for hosting the annual Thanksgiving luncheon for the Senior Center of Eastern Broome on Thursday, November 16. It was a great success and enjoyed by all who attended.

Additionally, I would like to congratulate Brendon Pike for his acceptance into the All-State band and orchestra for the second year in a row. What a great accomplishment!

Lourdes Student Assistance Program at Harpursville

Lourdes Student Assistance Program is a program operated through Ascension Lourdes and is a grant program funded through the New York State Office of Addiction Services and Supports (OASAS), which focuses on risk factors for youth that could lead to possible problems in the future. Risk factors can include school truancy, academic failure, family conflict, friends engaged in substance use, family history of substance use, and so forth.

The Lourdes behavioral health counselor will be located in the Jr./Sr. High School but is able to work with students of all grade levels. Our behavioral health counselor uses motivational interviewing techniques while working one-onone with students to develop goals that can be achieved in a short period of time (90 days or less) and can help address the risk factors identified in the student's life. Our counselor also offers evidence-based curricula focused on the topics of substance use at both the middle and high school levels.
