

### **History Surrounds Us**

This fall, high school students in the Colesville History elective have been able to explore and learn about our area's history through field trips, activities, and presentations.

Our students took a field trip to the town hall where they participated in a letterboxing activity led by Town Historian Sam Conrad. During the activity, students were given historical and navigational clues to find hidden stamps to add to their logbooks. Through this process, they were able to learn about and visit: the Doraville Schoolhouse, St. Luke's Church and Museum, the gravesite of Revolutionary War drummer boy Bateman Dickinson at Harpur Cemetery, and the memorial site of Rebecca Kellogg Ashley.

Students had previously learned about Rebecca Kellogg Ashley, an interpreter stationed at the Haudenosaunee Settlement at Onaquaga in the mid-1700s until her death in 1757 in class. Eileen Ruggeiri, the Old Onaquaga Historical Society's president gave the class a presentation on Ashley and accompanied the students as they visited her memorial near Dutchtown Road.


Students also learned about a Binghamton University archaeological dig that took place on Amedeo Cimini's property in North Colesville at Unitaria. Cimini said the dig yielded evidence that the property most likely housed the area's post office as well as a portion of the Rockwell-Hurlburt Equestrian Troupe. The Troupe traveled throughout the nation, performing in shows and several members of the group lost their lives when the ship they were traveling on sank in the Pacific Northwest.


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
The students were also able to use their creativity to recreate John Lamphere's (the first known white settler in the area) cabin for a "Gingerbread House" contest.

Finally, these young historians presented in our annual "Voices in the Dark" in Riverview Cemetery. There, they were joined by Sam Conrad, Eileen Ruggieri, and Darla Dayton and collectively spoke in first person from the graves of town notables, such as John Lamphere, Robert Harpur, Dr. John Bancroft, and Shawn Livingston (who won a gold medal in the Special Olympics for bowling).

History is truly all around us and through the community's support, our students were able to learn and appreciate their own.






#### Farewell Mr. Rullo
