

# Letter from the Superintendent

### Dear Harpursville Community Members,

I hope this message finds you well and that your New Year is off to a fantastic start, filled with joy and positivity. As we settle into 2025, I want to take a moment to express my gratitude and share some exciting updates with you.

### **Holiday Season Appreciation**

First and foremost, a heartfelt thank you to everyone who contributed to making the holiday season at our school truly special. Your efforts and enthusiasm did not go unnoticed. It's great to see the strong sense of community that thrives in Harpursville, and I sincerely appreciate all you do to support our students and staff.

### **Small-Capital Project Update**

I'm pleased to report that Phase One of our capital project is well underway and progressing nicely. Here's a brief overview of where things stand:

Our softball field is about 90% complete. The outfield sod has been laid and will be ready for the spring season, and the infield artificial turf has been installed.

The foundation and footers for the new transportation building are being laid. The building itself will be erected in the spring, with an anticipated completion date in August.

#### **Budget and Multipurpose Courts**

Due to inflation in construction costs since the project's initial planning and approval by the New York State Education Department, some bids came in higher than estimated. To remain within budget, we made the difficult decision to remove the multipurpose courts from Phase One.

However, we recognize the importance of having outdoor playing surfaces for tennis, basketball, pickleball, and more. To address this, we propose funding the multipurpose courts through the Capital Reserve Fund. This reserve was previously approved by the community for projects like this, so using these funds will **not impact taxes**.

To move forward, we will need voter approval. The vote for the multipurpose courts is scheduled on Jan. 28, 2025, from 1-8 p.m. In the event of cancellation due to snow or other emergencies, the vote will take place on Feb. 4, 2025. The proposal includes demolishing the existing basketball court and constructing new multipurpose courts at an estimated cost of \$525,000, to be fully funded by the preexisting Capital Reserve Fund.

We will send out a follow-up notice in early January with detailed information about the project scope and financials.

### **Celebrating Student Achievements**

Our schools were alive with talent throughout the holiday season! The outstanding performances by our



chorus, band and orchestra were truly impressive. Your attendance and support at these events are invaluable, and we sincerely appreciate your encouragement throughout the year.

Congratulations to the following students for their acceptance into the All-County Band: Maxamus Allen, Elizabeth Ives, Xander Quick, and CJ Closs.

### **New Girls' Wrestling Program**

I would also like to extend my gratitude to Mr. Quick and Coach Miller for their efforts in launching our new girls' wrestling program. The team currently has 17 participants and recently placed 10th out of 33 teams in their latest tournament. Congratulations to the entire team!

### **Robotics Team Recognition**

Congratulations to the two Robo Hornets teams that went to the Chittenango Robotics tournament the weekend of Dec. 14th. Out of 42 teams, both teams made it to the final 16 elimination round. Liem Donahue, Alex Afify, Jacob Rueffer, and Glenn Miller won both the Skills competition and were tournament Champions. What a fantastic start to your season of competitions!

### **Voices in the Dark Held at Riverview Cemetery**


