

Letter from the Superintendent

Dear Harpursville School Community,

I hope this newsletter finds you all in good health and spirits.

As we transition from winter into the spring season, I am hopeful that the weather will be mild, bringing favorable conditions for our upcoming spring sports. It has been a joy to witness our student-athletes in action, and as we distribute this newsletter, our students are gearing up for preseason spring sports practices. With the end of the school year rapidly approaching, we are planning various year-end activities to celebrate our students' achievements throughout the academic year.

Congratulations are in order for our music department. We had 15 students participate in the All-County Winterfest for band and chorus. Additionally, we will have 27 students participating in the spring All-County Festival this month. What a great showing for the program! Congratulations to Mrs. Cole, Mr. Campanella, and all our student musicians. We are proud of the growth that has occurred in the music program.

Our RoboHornets VEX robotics teams continue to excel, showcasing their skills and teamwork. We are proud of their achievements this year and extend our appreciation to Mr. Salisbury for his guidance. These students are not only mastering technological concepts but also developing invaluable life skills in collaboration and sportsmanship.

During the February Board of Education Meeting, Dr. Miller and I reviewed the district's strategic action plan that was developed last year with school and community stakeholders. During the presentation, we outlined where we were in fulfilling the goals that were developed by the school-community Strategic Action Plan Committee and the steps the district will be taking to continue moving forward to meet the objectives. As we get closer to the end of the year, we will again be conducting a district and community-wide strengths and needs survey, reconvening the strategic action plan committee to evaluate our progress, and updating the plan as needed.

In addition to our strategic action plan committee, Dr. Miller and I met with three student groups: one from our elementary school, another from our junior high and our high school students. Like our strategic action planning for the district and community, we asked the students on the advisory teams to identify



strengths and areas for improvement in our schools from their perspective. Their feedback will be invaluable in guiding our work within the overall strategic action plan and helping our building teams develop schedules and policies for the next school year.

We have received the initial 2025–2026 budget proposal from the governor. While the governor's initial proposal is not as severe as last year, the increase in revenue from the state is still less than the increase in expenditures. Like last year, we are closely monitoring the budget information coming from Albany. Despite the challenges, we remain committed to providing an instructional program that meets the needs of all students while ensuring fiscal responsibility. We value community input, and our budget calendar includes opportunities for feedback and participation. We will continue to prioritize providing our students with outstanding educational experiences within the constraints of the budget.

Thank you for your continued support and collaboration as we navigate these challenges together.

"I Have a Dream" is one of the greatest speeches in American history. Delivered by Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. in Washington, D.C. in 1963, the speech is a powerful rallying cry for racial equality and a fairer world in which black Americans enjoy the same freedoms, opportunities, and privileges as white Americans. He speaks of the urgency for a new America and cautions his audience not to give way to bitterness and hatred, but to fight for justice in the right manner—with dignity and discipline. He also acknowledges that poor and marginalized white Americans may feel a kinship with the civil rights movement, urging all impacted Americans to join together in the cause.

The Studio Art class listened to his speech and selected

a segment that resonated with them. They envisioned an illustration representing his words, brainstorming three sketches to work from. They then chose the sketch that best captured the powerful rallying points of that part of Dr. King's historic speech and developed it into

A huge thank you to the Binghamton University Kung Fu Club and the Nineveh Library for this incredible experience!



You must meet certain basic qualifications to run for the school board in New York State. You must be a U.S. citizen, at least 18 years old, a qualified voter in the school district, able to read and write and a resident of your district continuously for one year before the election. Contact the District Clerk to make an appointment to pick up a petition by calling 607-693-8112. Petitions must be returned to the District Office no later than April 21, 2025, at 3 p.m.

From the Health Office

As a reminder, our health offices are now offering virtual walk-in visits for students through UHS. If our school nurses identify a concern that can be resolved virtually, they will contact parents/ guardians to discuss details and receive permission to proceed. Once approved, the student and parent/ guardian will join the medical provider online to address the issue at hand.

These visits will be billed as regular walk-in visits through your insurance, providing a convenient way to minimize disruptions to students' education. We
